TO THE VETERANS, FAMILIES AND FRIENDS OF THE 517TH PARACHUTE REGIMENTAL COMBAT TEAM

It is with deep regret my wife Deborah and I are unable to join you in person this evening in Atlanta. On behalf of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, I wish to extend our greetings and best wishes to everyone gathered for this very special reunion.

It is difficult to pinpoint what made a unit like the 517th so uncommonly successful in battle and so distinctive in character. Some point to your intensive and isolated training in the hinterlands of northeastern Georgia. Others, like Joe Miller, said that from the bottom looking up, "It was leadership."

Some believe it was the 517th's spirit of family and that you couldn't bear to let your brothers down. Tom Cross simply offered, "You had the feeling that the 517th would always be home for you."

Whatever it was that made the 517th a first-class fighting force with esprit and élan second to none, perhaps only those who fought under its banner can truly understand why the bonds between its own have endured so long after the guns fell silent.

I remember that strength in my own Uncle Charlie, known to many of you as First Sergeant Chuck Boyer in Headquarters 3rd Battalion.
