Christmas Greetings!

Christmas is a season of joy.

I can never understand those who say that the season is depressing to some people. It never is to me. Take back in '44 when we were up to our ears in snow, bitter cold, German forces hitting us with all they had and we ordered to drive them back. We should have been depressed. It had been so cloudy from the first attack on December 16, 1944 until Christmas day that the air corps, which according to their song could not be stopped, were stopped by clouds, fog and snow. That was the case until Christmas morning which dawned cold and clear. Air support and the sun was our Christmas gift. I will never forget those planes with big stars clearly visible going overhead to give us some badly needed assistance.

(Incidentally, this is why whenever anyone sang, "Nothing can stop the Army Air Corps, the 517th troopers always added, "except the weather")

So, let us emulate those lowly shepherds on the lowest rung of the social latter but first to get the message, "Lo, I bring you glad tidings of great joy, Christ the Savior is born".

Kent, you should never be cautious of letting the chips fall where they may. Although I may have a memory, I make mistakes and am the first to admit it. I tell the VA nurses here that all doers make mistakes, so if you don't want to risk mistakes, don't do ANYTHING. In the 517th we had the saying, "Don't just sit there, do something even if it is wrong". And this is bad advice to give some people. I knew your uncle **Floyd Stott** and **Jim Birder** very well and can tell them apart even today if I have a clear picture. Jim was a little heavier than Floyd. I knew Floyd better as he was another lowan I had known as long back as at our stay at lowa U.

And yes, I do have some recollection of **Lt. Rea**. He was in the same BOQ with **Russ Miller** and me at Ft. Benning when we went through Jump School in October, 1943. Although Ft. Benning was a fine post with many permanent brick buildings, this was not a posh BOQ. It was a one story temporary WWII barracks with the latrine and showers at one end and all the rest open space with cots and footlockers designating our individual territory. So we had some acquaintance with all the other officers who filled the space. Lt Rea had a jump injury or some health problem that took him to sick call each day so he wasn't in out jump class. He may have already qualified as a trooper by then. He drove a big 4 door LaSalle automobile. (For those who don't remember the LaSalle, it was a Cadillac's little brother, like the Bentley is to the Rolls Royce.) On our last night at Ft. Benning, before we shipped out to Camp Mackall and the 517th, Lt. Rea offered to let Russ and me use his car for the evening. Although we intended to stay sober, and did so, we did not accept this generous offer and attended a movie to celebrate our completion of the courses and goodbye to Ft. Benning, our home since June for OCS and Jump School.

Lt. Rea joined us during the bulge and from this mail call was in B Co., 1st Bn. and Hq. 2nd. I was in neither so didn't get a chance to meet Lt. Rea again. I do remember that his death was the result of a direct hit from a German 88 which was reported to have dismembered his body. This is a sad note on which to end this Christmas message, but it was something we endured many times over in 1944-1945.

I wish all of you a VERY MERRY CHRISTMAS 2012 FULL OF PEACE AND JOY.



You can see Major Frazer on the pictures and Suzan Boyle... Col. Boyle's daughter!




