- 1, The 1st Bn, 517 Parachute Regt, was placed under my command on 22 Dec 44 and served under me in combat until relieved on 26 Dec 44.
- 2. Upon arrival at approximately 1500, 22 Dec 44, the battalion had been traveling by motor since the previous day. It was committed to an attack almost immediately, and fought continuously until 1100, 24 Dec 44. One company was then disposed to protect the road captured in this action and the remainler of the battalion swept the adjoining terrain. Some rest was obtained the night of 24 Dec 44, but at 1430, 25 Dec 44, the battalion was recommitted to capture the objective originally assigned to the 3d En, 290th Inf. This was accomplished by 2400, 25 Dec 44, but the remainder of the night was spent in reorganizing and aiding the 3d Bn, 290th Inf for the defense of the objective. The 1st Bn, 517th Parachute Regt, was finally able to pull back at 1500, 26 Dec 44.
- 3. Throughout this operation which involved intense fighting against elements of the 116 Pz Div and the 560 VG Div, the battalion exhibited an extremely high sense of, and devotion to, duty. They are clearly among the highest type troops of this or any other army.
- 4. It is especially desired to commend Lt Col W. J. Boyle, the commander, and Maj D. W. Fraser, the battalion executive.
